Our mural team visited the He Tohu exhibition at the National Library. They came away brimming with ideas for our 2024 mural and planning is well underway.

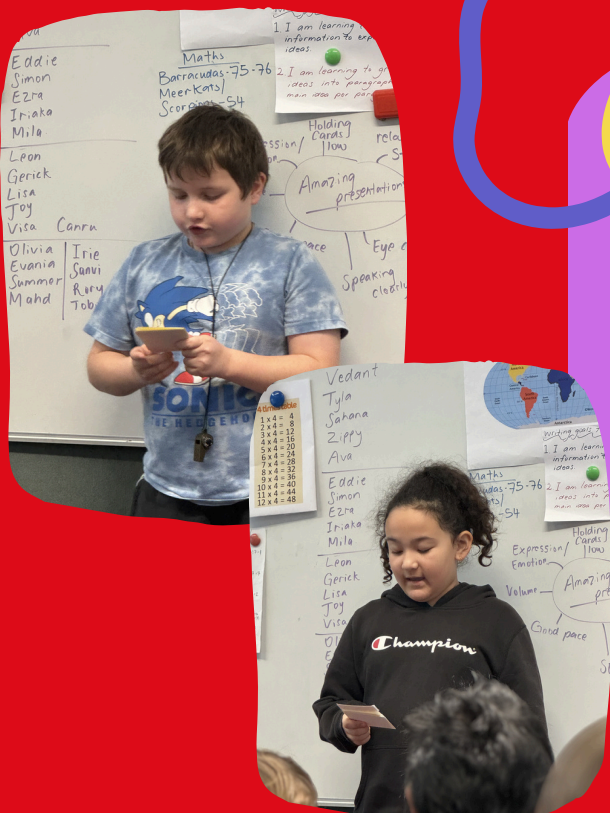


## MANA TAMARIKI

Mei, Tanvith, Maxwell and Suhaas.

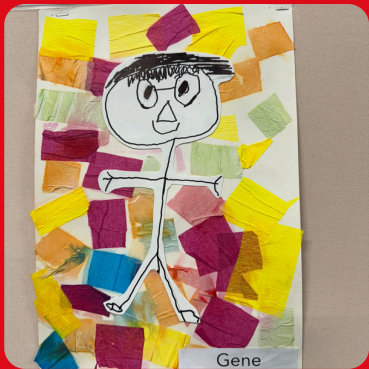

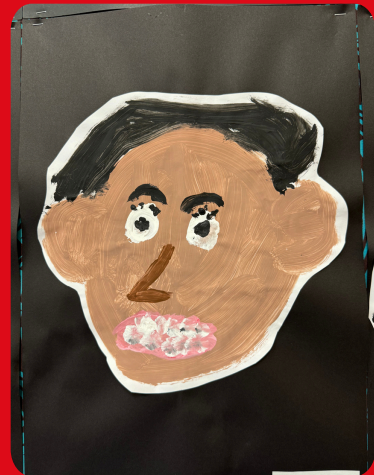
