Learning at Mt Cook School

At Mt Cook School we have carefully selected a New Zealand based programme for our Teina Rohe (Year 0-3) called Better Start Literacy Approach (BSLA).

We are now in the third week of teaching BSLA and you might have noticed a few changes. Each week the teachers will post a one-page summary on Seesaw about what the children are learning in class. It will include the name of the book they are reading, some exciting new words, the sounds they are learning, and a fun activity for you to try at home. This page provides great ways for you to support your child at home.

If you speak another language at home, you can continue to talk with your child about the stories, what the words mean and help them to listen to the sounds in your home language.
