What's new for teaching

Over the past few years, staff at Mt Cook School have been on a te reo Māori journey.

To normalise te reo Māori in our kura we have been prioritising the teaching of te reo Māori and tikanga.

Staff have participated in Te Ahu o te Māori and we currently hold te reo Māori hui fortnightly for staff.

With the support of Whaea Nanaia we will teach all tamariki Kapa Haka, waiata, karakia and the procedures around pōwhiri.

Our goal is to see, hear and experience te reo Māori throughout our kura.
